Ben was born on March 29, 1948 in Yazoo City, Mississippi, the son of Herman and Mary Louise (Stewart) Green, one of thirteen children. He was raised in Troy and graduated from Buchanan High School in 1966. He believed in hard work and started his construction career at 17. Most of his work was in the construction industry as a welder and truck driver. For nineteen years, Ben worked at Kaplan Lumber Company in St. Peters. Ben managed the Troy Senior Patriots through the Eastern Missouri Baseball Association from March 1979 to 1992. He was a member of the Teamsters Local Union 682 since 1977. Lastly, he enjoyed reading the daily newspaper and doing the puzzles. Ben was married to Alesia Frazier in December 31, 1970 and resided in Bowling Green.
