Charles C. Shotton, 86, of Bowling Green, passed away Friday, April 12, 2024 in Louisiana, Missouri. He was born in Denver Colorado, on September 19, 1937 to Paul C. Shotton and Daffron Givens Shotton. His family moved to California and later to Pike County where he grew up and graduated from Louisiana High School in 1955. He married Helen (Page) Shotton in June 1963 enjoying 33 years together before she preceded him in death. Also deceased his first wife Marlene Orf. Others preceding his passing were his two siblings Lloyd (Buddy) Shotton of High Ridge, Charlene (Jackie) Marshall of Vandalia and his aunts Kathryn Shotton and Frances (Shotton) Carfagno.

He also worked over the road as a welder. This skill led him to teaching many youths and adults at Pike Lincoln Technical Center, Lewis and Clark Career Center and St. Charles Community College until he retired. His love for teaching allowed him many more years substituting for Bowling Green High School as well. Once officially retired, he continued to volunteer for the Pike County Fair Board and Pike Co-Food Bank.

He loved the outdoors spending time throwing horseshoes, bee keeping, hunting and fishing with his family and good friends. If he was not home, he could be on the river in his camper or pulling it to a vacation spot. All who knew Charlie loved his artistic ability too. He was a master flintknapper and could make the most beautiful arrow heads, welded sculptures and animals, made apple butter and wood carving of decoys, fish and other wildlife. He was never idle and still making primitive folk art with wood until his passing.
