



## Dora Frances (Dodie) Wells Harness

October 8, 1907 - November 3, 2015

Dora Frances (Dodie) Wells Harness passed away Tuesday, November 2, 2015 following a short illness. Dodie was blessed with a long and productive life of 108 years, 25 days.

Funeral services will be held 11:00 a.m., Friday, November 6, 2015 at the Hopke Christian Church in New Hartford. Burial will be in the Ashley Fairview Cemetery. Visitation will be from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. Thursday at the Bibb-Veach Funeral Home in Bowling Green.

Miss Dodie was born October 8, 1907 in New Hartford, the daughter of Lemuel A. and Mary Higginbotham Wells. She attended Hopke School during her grade school years. In her high school and college years, Miss Dodie attended and graduated in 1927 from Christian College, Columbia, Missouri carrying the traditional ivy chain as her Mother had done when she graduated from Christian College in 1900. Other than school and traveling, Miss Dodie lived all of her life at the New Hartford family farm and home built in the 1872 that she cherished.

In 1947, she married Cecil E. Harness who preceded her in death. They were the parents of one son, Cecil Wells Harness who survives. Dodie's Mother died following childbirth at an early age while Miss Dodie was a student at Christian College. When Dodie returned to the Family home following her graduation, Dodie became Mother to her youngest sister, Jimmie and they remained as close as any Mother and Daughter until Jimmie's death.

Miss Dodie became an elementary school teacher in the Middletown and Silex

Schools. To this day, she has former pupils who recount how much they enjoyed her as a teacher. Miss Dodie was a savvy business woman, helping her Father with his various ventures as well as her own.

Dodie was preceded in death by her Mother and Father, four sisters, Virginia Wells Buffum, Mettie Anne Wells, Lucy Wells Forsyth, Jimmie Wells Dolan and one brother, Lemual A. Wells, Jr. A niece, Mary Frances Dolan, nephew Pat Dolan, III and great nephews, Eric Buffum and Robert Wells also preceded her in death. Surviving in addition to her son are a daughter in law, Lorraine Harness; two grandchildren Cecil Wells Harness, Jr of New Hartford and Anne Harness Ganten of Virginia; four great grandchildren, Cecil Dustin Harness, Sarah Ann Harness, Samuel Ganten and Alexandre Ganten; nephews, Frank Buffum, John Buffum, Lemuel Wells, III, Jim Wells and their Families and Sister-in-Law Claudia Wells.

Dodie remained a member of the Bowling Green Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution until her death, served for many years as Secretary-Treasurer of the Ashley Fairview Cemetery, was an active member of the Eureka Homemaker's Club, served on the Pike County Nurses' Education Board, was a member of and treasurer for the Hopke Christian Church and was a strong supporter of Christian College (now Columbia College).

Miss Dodie will be most remembered for her great love for her family, her kindness to others and her ability to make all around her comfortable in body and spirit.
