Emily M. Smith, age 91, of Bowling Green passed away February 23, 2015 at the Moore Pike Nursing Home in Bowling Green.

After her retirement, she served as a lay pastor, serving the Methodist Churches of Bowling Green, Eolia and Oak Grove. She was a local and county 4-H leader, a member of the Hill and Hollow Club of Vera, as well as the VFW Local #5553 Ladies Auxiliary where she served as chaplain for many years.

She enjoyed embroidery and sewing and other needle crafts. She was known for being an excellent baker and enjoyed making wedding cakes. When she lived on the farm, Emily enjoyed raising registered Polled Hereford cattle. Above all, she enjoyed spending time with her family.
