He loved working on his cousins farm, and the land that was originally owned by his beloved Grandpa Deters. He'd often come home from being on the road driving a truck, just to help get the crops in or out of the field. Herman owned his own big rig, a blue Mack Truck and hauled a dedicated run from Iowa to Palmyra, MO for four years. He worked out of Clarksville, and Louisville, NE hauling bulk cement for Transwood Trucking from 1992 until his illness kept him from working. Herman loved his family, the farm, watching Nascar, and RFD-TV. He could always tell you what the weather was going to do; he loved talking to his boys and nephews about their cars, trucks, baseball and how things were going for them.
