Linda Ruth Logan, age 80, of Eolia, Missouri, passed away at her home surrounded by her family on February 23, 2026. She had an abiding interest in healthy living and became dedicated to healthy diet and general healthy habits and their benefits.

She found great joy and meaning in being a mother. She loved her children with devotion and nurturing. Her children saw her as a never changing source of love, nurture, and guidance. And in this she found fulfillment of some of her greatest hopes and dreams.

She and her husband shared 59 years of loving, growing together, learning, finding ways through the rough spots, sharing life with their wider family circle, sharing friendships with many people, seeking God's will, loving their children and experiencing joy together from the things that were most important to them.
