Mary Sue "Fussie" Murray, age 97 of Bowling Green, passed away Monday, December 29, 2014 at the Moore-Pike Nursing Home in Bowling Green surrounded by her family. Funeral services will be held at 10:00 am Saturday at the First Presbyterian Church in Bowling Green with Lay Pastor Chris Gamm officiating.
