Terence Jay Nadler, age 67, of Middletown, MO, passed away unexpectedly Sunday, September 21, 2025, at his residence.

Cremation rites are under the direction of Bibb-Veach Funeral Homes in Bowling Green. A family held celebration of life will be held at a later date.

Terri was born January 8, 1958, in St. Charles, MO, the son of Oscar Herman Nadler, Jr., and Lorraine Estelle (Iffrig) Nadler. He grew up in St. Charles County, attended St. Joseph Elementary School in Cottleville, and attended Francis Howell Schools where he was active in track, FFA, and horticulture.

Following graduation in 1976, he worked as a horticulturist at Six Flags in Eureka, MO for two years and then returned to his father's excavation business where he worked alongside his father for many years. He later worked for NOR-VEL in Bridgeton, as well as currently working at Kolb Grading in Weldon Spring.

In the few moments that Terri didn't find himself working, he was known to enjoy woodworking and tinkering on tractors. When he did occasionally sit, he could be found enjoying Gun Smoke on the television, listening to county gold music or the beach boys, and was known to use the phrase "That's A Good Idea!"

As a man known for being a jokester and putting others before himself, Terri was always known for being a gentleman, wanting to put a smile on others faces and making sure no one ever felt like they were a stranger.

Those left behind to carry Terri's legacy include his children, Josh Nadler of the state of Maryland, Danielle Nadler of Troy, and Dusty Nadler of Troy; grandchildren Hunter and Maxwell Nadler; siblings Renè Tune and husband Ron of Lake of the Ozarks, Scott Nadler and wife Kathy of Lake of the Ozarks, Randy Nadler of Boerne, TX, Stephanie English of St. Charles, and Tricia Johnson and husband Jim of Middletown; many nieces, nephews, cousins and extended family.
