Virginia Louise "Mick" Perkins, 89, of Bowling Green, passed away Wednesday, April 15, 2026, at Oak Pointe Memory Care in Warrenton.

A Memorial Service for Virginia will be held Monday, April 20, 2026, at 10am at Bibb-Veach Funeral Homes and Crematory in Bowling Green. Memorial visitation will be from 9:00am until the time of service.

She enjoyed listening to gospel country music and watching Biblical programs at home with her husband.
